Oncology - the Evidence Base of Mistletoe in Integrative Oncology



PRESENTER - Dr med. Marion Debus

Dr Debus will present the current research updates and published scientific literature on mistletoe (*viscum album* extracts VAE) and its use in integrative oncology as an adjuvant therapy to chemotherapy, radiotherapy and the immunotherapies. The evidence presented aims to serve as a foundation for the future of integrative oncology, and to strengthen inter-professional relationships between qualified medical practitioners prescribing mistletoe and oncologists in the Southern Hemisphere. Dr Debus will present Integrative Oncology Best Practices for optimal physical, psychological and spiritual dimensions of patient care based out of the insights of Anthroposophic medicine.

Dr Debus is Head of the Department of Oncology and anthroposophic physician at the Klinik Arlesheim, Switzerland and senior physician in interdisciplinary oncology.
